Chandon, Brut, Napa, NV	32
Smoky and toasty, with crisp, tight pear and spice flavors that are well focused and complex. Has a smooth, fleshy texture and finishes with a hint of earthiness that adds dimension. (WS)	
Segura Viudas, Cava, Heredad Reserva, Spain, NV	36
Great toasty aromas, smooth texture and fruity, spicy flavors that linger on the finish. (WS)	
Argyle, Brut, Willamette Valley, Oregon, USA, 2002	36
Bright and juicy, lively with spicy, vanilla scented pear and ginger flavors, echoing nicely on the round finish. - WS	
Jean Laurent, Brut, Blanc de Noirs, Champagne, France, NV	60
Very fruity, exhibiting red berry, black currant and quince aromas and flavors on a lively structure. Vinous, with balance and a lingering finish. (WS)	
Piper Heidseck, Extra Dry, Champagne, France, NV	60
A well-rounded, balanced sparkler, showing hazelnut, citrus and honey flavors, augmented by toast, well-integrated with the medium-bodied weight and lively structure. (WS)	
Louis Roederer, Brut Premier, Champagne, France, NV	60
Pale golden colour. Delicate, persistent beading. Rich yet subtle bouquet with hints of hawthorn, almonds and toast. Clean attack, creamy structure. The inclusion of reserve wines gives the complexity and roundness characteristic of Louis Roederer champagnes. Arguably the best NV!	
Veuve Cliquot, Brut, Champagne, France, NV	70
A bracing Champagne, boasting almond, honey and ginger flavors. Appealing texturally, it firms up on the finish, but sure to be a crowd pleaser. (WS)	
Bollinger, Brut, Special Cuvee, Champagne, France, NV	80
A combination of freshness and maturity highlight this medium-bodied bubbly. The flavors evoke toast, nuts and citrus, while the vivid acidity keeps it all focused. (WS)	
Bollinger, Brut, Grande Année, Champagne, France, 1999	160
Fine depth and complexity in both aromas and flavors. Citrus, ginger, vanilla, whole-grain bread and nut elements combine for a harmonious presentation. Full-bodied, yet sophisticated and lively. A long, luxurious finish. (WS)	
Moet & Chandon, Cuvee Dom Perignon, Champagne, France, 2001	195
There's a high-toned minty graphite accent to the aroma, with a citric edge on the palate. The structure is overlaid with lemon and bread dough notes. This is tight and crisp on the finish, so break out the sole or shellfish, or wait a few years. Best from 2008 through 2020.	
Louis Roederer, Brut, Cristal, Champagne, France, 2000	290
This goes for personality and finesse. An assertive, honeyed style, with plenty of citrus flavors. Mature coffee and roasted nut accents are peeking through, with a robust structure and a dried citrus aftertaste. Drink now through 2025.
